By God's grace, that first step of obedience led to a medical clinic that continues to save lives and thus reducing mortality by 99% in a remote region. Fourteen years later, we are preparing for our 12th Annual HUHO Gala, continuing our calling to Renew Communities and Restore Lives.

Through your generosity in 2025, we were able to:

- Equip Guatemalan physicians to serve over 2,000 patients
- Provide transportation for inner-city students to attend RKC tutoring
- Support New Life Women & Children's Home with funding and essential supplies
- Serve our unhoused neighbors through our There Is Hope outreach in Manchester, NH

2025 Events Highlights



Gala - March 7, 2025

The 2025 HUHO Gala was a resounding success, selling out and reflecting the extraordinary generosity and commitment of our community. Thanks to the overwhelming support of our guests, sponsors, donors, and volunteers, the Gala directly funded impactful work both locally and internationally.

Proceeds from the evening were thoughtfully distributed to mission partners whose work aligns with HUHO's commitment to service, compassion, and restoration. Together, we invested in children and families, supported unhoused neighbors, and equipped frontline medical teams with life-saving resources.

The following highlights the impact made possible through the evening's fundraising efforts.

- **Roca Kidz Club**
 - \$2,000 donated to support children and families through programs centered on hope, creativity, and care.
- **Place of the Skull Motorcycle Mission**
 - \$1,740 donated to their Practical Needs Fund, directly supporting unhoused neighbors with essentials and outreach.
- **Vision International Missions - Guatemala Medical Team**
 - Medical equipment donated to strengthen frontline care, including:
 - Portable EKG machine
 - Five vital-sign kits with pulse oximeters
 - Digital thermometers
 - Fetal Doppler for maternal health monitoring
 - Mind Ray z60 portable ultrasound machine
 - Prestige 2100 Series Autoclave Sterilizer

2025 Events Highlights



There is Hope - November 28, 2025

Through the collective efforts of dedicated community partners, volunteers, and faith-based organizations, this outreach provided comprehensive, wraparound support to individuals and families in need. From nourishing meals and essential supplies to medical care, housing connections, recovery resources, and spiritual support, the day was designed to meet people where they were and address both immediate needs and long-term pathways forward. The following highlights reflect the breadth of care, compassion, and hope made possible through this collaborative effort.

FOOD & FELLOWSHIP

- Rizza's Pizza, Domino's, and Ron's Prayer Ministry Van (with Brent Clark) provided hot coffee, water, milk, and meals. Place of the Skull Motorcycle Ministry donated and distributed a wide range of food and essentials, including hot coffee, soup, hot chocolate, donuts, protein snacks, milk, toiletry kits, wipes, socks, backpacks, winter accessories, rain ponchos, emergency wraps, and meal kits.

CLINICAL CARE & SUPPORT

- Health Care for the Homeless and the TIH Clinical Team provided medical care, RN assessments, physical therapy, nutritional support, and first-aid supplies. Additional services included haircuts and beard trims from Gloss & Mane Hair Studio, vision screenings and reading glasses from the Lions Club, and harm-reduction resources from Better Life Partners, including Narcan and fentanyl test kits.

HOUSING & RECOVERY SUPPORT

- Live Free Recovery and Second Chance Recovery supported individuals seeking treatment, with one unhoused individual enrolling in inpatient care on site. Helping Hands for Men secured immediate housing for one individual, while Elmgrove Housing qualified attendees for affordable housing. Freedom Staffing connected participants with employment opportunities, and New Life Women & Children's Home and Thrive provided trauma-informed care, prayer, and crisis counseling.

CLOTHING & WINTER ESSENTIALS

- Volunteers and partners distributed sleeping bags, warm outerwear, shoes, blankets, boots, hats, gloves, and scarves to help individuals prepare for winter conditions.

FAMILIES & FAITH

- Roca Kidz Club created a welcoming space for children and families through crafts and activities. Federal Chaplains, Zeal Church, and Life Church offered prayer, mentorship, and spiritual support, resulting in 11 individuals choosing to begin a faith journey.

From Fire to Restoration

In the wake of a Manchester fire that broke out in an apartment complex on January 1, the HUHO Foundation, led by Camille Gaydos, mobilized quickly and prayerfully to ensure that every need of one of the affected families was met. Through an incredible outpouring of support, the young family received a \$500 Target gift card from Elm Grove Companies, a privately donated \$100 gift, and secured housing with an apartment that included a capped \$750 security deposit. Members of the Life Church stepped up in powerful ways by providing food, clothing, toys, emotional support, and committed to ongoing care for the family.

Additional generosity came from Food For Children and Apparel Impact, each contributing \$500, with Apparel Impact also supplying a large bag of properly sized clothing for the entire family. A concerned local citizen and Andrew Gaydos coordinated a Walmart shopping spree to ensure essentials were covered, including formula for the family's 8-month-old. This is a beautiful example of faith in action and a community coming together in prayer, compassion, and tangible support.

There is Hope - Neal's Story

Last year at the There is HOPE event, attendees came together to pray for Neal, who was facing homelessness and struggling with addiction. Through the power of prayer and community support, Neal has turned his life around.

Since that time, he has successfully overcome his drug addiction and is no longer homeless. With assistance from a Baptist church in Hooksett, he was provided with the support needed to secure an apartment.

Neal wants everyone to know that his journey of recovery and stability all started with a prayer at the There is HOPE event.

This remarkable story serves as a powerful reminder of the impact that faith, community, and hope can have in transforming lives.
